Monsieur le Délégué,

In accordance with instructions received from His Britannic Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, I have the honour to propose that the Monetary Agreement between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Swiss Government, signed in London on 12th March 1946, as extended and modified by the Exchanges of Notes between those Governments on 25th February/3rd March 1949, 4th March 1950, and 10th November 1950, shall be extended for a further period of three months from 11th March 1951.

If the Swiss Government agree to this proposal, I have the honour to suggest that the present Note and your reply in that sense shall be regarded as constituting an agreement between the two Governments.

I avail myself of this opportunity to renew to you, Monsieur le Délégué, the assurance of my highest consideration.
