Dear Mr. Kessi:

Reference is made to your two letters of February 19, and 27, 1969, in which you informed the Embassy of your plan to protect the Embassy's property at 14 Taubenstrasse, Bern, in case of demonstrations.

Permission to enter onto the grounds at 14 Taubenstrasse in case of demonstrations or riots is hereby granted, should such entry be deemed necessary by the Bern Police. It is, however, hoped that your office will inform the Embassy prior to taking any such actions.

The Embassy is in full accord with you regarding the usefulness of having a hydrant on the grounds. It finds, however, the cost for the installation of such a hydrant very substantial, according to the estimate approx. SFr. 10'000.00. Unfortunately, such an amount is not readily available for this purpose and Mr. Portman of the Embassy has been instructed to find, if possible, a more economical solution.

The Embassy appreciates your interest and cooperation in this matter.
