instant that vessels laden with grain proceeding to

Bordeaux or St. Nazaire will not be interfered with

As regards vessels bound for Rotterdam, I would point out that, as you will doubtless recognise, cargoes of grain going up the Rhine have practically no chance of reaching Switzerland. His Majesty's Government therefore trust that all future consignments will be directed to more convenient ports such as Bordeaux, St. Nazaire or Genoa.
