## 2. Ongoing projects

a) Support to sanvodaya Movement (Helvetas)

at present two experts are in the field, one in the dry zone looking after construction of schools for agriculturists and of extension centers. The second works in the tea estate regions and helps contruct water supply schemes for the "lines" (houses of tea estate workers).

Preliminary phase (1977 - 1978): Study technical feasibility of project idea. Proved possible - see Report

Proposal was discussed in April in Sri Lanka, principles are accepted. DDA credit now being prepared, field activities started approx. Oct. 1979. Closecooperation with all concerned ministries / agencies considered.

In the framework of this project, equipment needed for the Base Mapping Project is financed out of DDA funds (360'000.- Frs.). Rest USAID loan.
