Your Excellency,

You may recall that about a year ago I had the pleasure to meet you in Berne, when we were able, in a most cordial manner, to discuss matters of common concern to our two countries. One of the issues which I raised with you was the SF 250 million lending ceiling imposed by your Government on South Africa for new financial credits to be made available each year.

I have just paid a hurried visit to your beautiful country, mainly to meet with your important banking institutions, between whom and ourselves there exists the closest and most valuable podis relationship. Immediately, once again, the que

of the credit ceiling came up - a matter which is causing your banks and my Government very real concern; so much so, that I have deemed it desirable to write this letter to you before even leaving your country.

You will appreciate that this arbitrary credit ceiling, imposed, I understand, only on South Africa, a country with the highest credit rating, and a country, moreover, which has never defaulted on a single debt obligation, is particularly unwelcome to banks which are able and willing to do lucrative business with us, and to a Government which has always sought to promote and maintain the friendliest relations with Switzerland.

This credit ceiling is hampering Swiss exports to South Africa as, apart from credit tied directly to Swiss exports, substantial portions of financial credits are used from time to time to acquire Swiss goods directly and indirectly, and thus promoting employment in Switzerland.

I do not have to remind you of my country's policy to sell in Switzerland, year in and year out, the great bulk of our gold production, a circumstance which I presume to think is not without significance to the Swiss economy.

Your Excellency will readily imagine that with the far-reaching developments in the gold market in recent years, South Africa is under heavy pressure from certain other countries to market its gold output through them. We, however, place a high value on maintaining our well-tried connections and relationships, and have always resisted such pressure.

With Switzerland's capacity to supply
the capital we can so productively use for the
genuine development of all our peoples, and with
the South African economy in a particularly
strong and stable condition and anxious to
increase its growth rate still further in the
interests especially of its Black, Coloured and
Indian people, I take the liberty to request you
once again to remove the arbitrary credit ceiling
which is now causing serious concern. I do so in
a most courteous but urgent manner.

I have thought it fit to send a copy of this letter to the President of the Swiss National Bank for his information.
