No 141 For Mr. Petitpierre Federal Councilor. Your letter of November 14 which crossed with ours of November 12th. It would seem to me very difficult to give State Department by official steps and handing of a note the impression that we would like to withdraw from the neutral Commission in Korea if State Dept. did not act according to your wishes. I would fear also that this would make a deplorable impression on American military persons. What we could do would be to talk "officieusement" to the State Department about your objections asking the Department to study a solution which would be acceptable.
