No 134. De M. Petitpierre pour Ministre Bruggmann,
Your telegram 141. I do not wish that you give State Dept.
impression that Switzerland intends to step out of Com-
mission neutre in Korea if our wishes not satisfied. Such
intention does not exist. I do not wish further official
steps since we are still in the period of "sondages" and
have not as yet received official request to take part in
that Commission. Very likely our wishes will not be satis-
fied but conversations must give us a chance to give in-
terpretation of our position of neutral State and event-
ually later on the sens in which we accepted the mission
entrusted to us. According to recent information from
Stockholm the Swedish government has decided to postpone
handing note until the return of Undeae to Stockholm. The
latter will be informed of our aide-memoire. One can ask
whether it is appropriate to take steps now at the State
Department in view of the discussions taking place at the
General Assembly about the proposition of India. There is
no urgency. Would ask for your eventual observations on
text of aide-memoire.
